We have reviewed the accompanying financial statements of The World Orphan Fund, Inc. (a Wisconsin nonprofit corporation), which comprise the statement of financial position as of December 31, 2015, and the related statement of activities and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements. A review includes primarily applying analytical procedures to management's financial data and making inquiries of management. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit, the objective of which is the expression of an opinion regarding the financial statements as a whole. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The World Orphan Fund, Inc. was formed in 2010 for the purposes of supporting orphanages around the world and raising awareness of the need to support orphanages and creating a system to assist orphanages in accessing supplies and resources. A summary of the organization's significant accounting policies follows:

A) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from these estimates.

B) Income Taxes

The organization is a not-for-profit organization that is exempt from income taxes under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code and classified by the Internal Revenue Service as other than a private foundation.

The organization is subject to the regulations for exempt organizations in the U.S. federal jurisdiction and the Wisconsin Department of Financial Institutions state jurisdiction. The organization's open years include the years ended December 31, 2015, 2014, 2013 and 2012.

C) Contributions

Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted net assets depending on the existence or nature of any donor restrictions. All cash contributions are dedicated to projects assisting orphan and orphanages. No cash contributions are used for organization overhead, fundraising or administration expenses.

D) Investments

Investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statements of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change of net assets. Investment income and gains restricted by a donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions are met (either by passage of time or by use) in the reporting period in which the income and gains are recognized.

Note 1 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

E) Marketing Costs

The organization expenses marketing costs when incurred. Marketing expense was \$521 in 2015.

H) Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flow, the organization considers all highly liquid investments available for current use with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Note 2 - Occupancy Costs

The organization does not have any occupancy costs. The organization shares an office space with the company of the President of the organization and the costs cannot be segregated.

Note 3 - Related Party Transactions

The organization received contributions from board members and a board member's company in support of the organization. The actual contributions totaled \$96,696 or 24.9% of the total contributions for the year ended December 31, 2015.

Note 4 - Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through November 12, 2016, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued.
